

## JOHN DAUGHERTY

John Daugherty is the results-driven Chief Information Officer of the Montana Department of Corrections and is responsible for overseeing the management, implementation, and operations of information systems and infrastructure that directly supports the mission of the Department. He brings strong management and leadership skills with the ability to motivate those he works with. He is forward thinking with an outstanding record of achievement in delivering innovative technical solutions to business operations.

John began his career with the Department in 1998 and has been instrumental in networking all of the Department field offices, the implementation an Inmate network at Montana State Prison, the development of system interfaces with justice agencies, the replacement of the Department's legacy offender management system, implementation of the Department's first youth information management system, and successful pilot of a NIEM compliant national victim notification standard under a grant from the IJIS institute and BJA.

John also serves as on the Montana Integrated Justice Information System Broker project steering committee. He has served on the executive board member of the Corrections Technology Association since 2003. He is one of the three founding members and current chair of the National Consortium of Offender Management Systems, which is responsible for the creation and management of the nation's only community source offender management system.

He has also served on the steering committee for the State of Montana Data Center (SMDC), the Montana Criminal Justice Information Sharing Project (MCJISP), as chair of the Montana Information Technology Managers Council (ITMC) from 2005 to 2007, as Montana's representative on the National Law Enforcement and Corrections Rocky Mountain Technology Assessment Committee, and as a member of State of Montana Computer Security Incident Response Team (CSIRT).

Joan Eliel is currently employed by the Montana Department of Justice as an Investigator/Program Specialist for the Office of Consumer Protection and Victim Services in Helena, Montana. Ms. Eliel is an Investigator for the Office of Consumer Protection Unauthorized Practice of Law and the Program Specialist for Montana's Project Passport, End-of-Life Registry, and Address Confidentiality Programs. She is currently involved in the piloting of two national projects, the Statewide Automated Victim Information Notification System IEPD and the Hope Card Project. Prior to joining the Montana Department of Justice in 2002, Ms. Eliel served six years as a Justice Court Judge in Dillon, Montana. She has served as a part of the working group for the Montana Integrated Justice Information Sharing Project since 2005 and is part of the Montana Justice Community of Interest (JCOI) stakeholders. •
